## Art Camps - Weeks 1,2,3,6,9,10

Have fun each day - painting, building sculpture or printmaking. The art lessons will not be repeated, so you can register for multiple weeks.



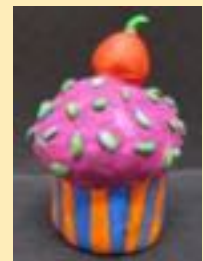
## Painting Camps - Weeks 1,4,5

Campers will look at various artists for inspiration to paint on paper and canvas using acrylics, watercolors, gouache and inks.



## Ceramic Camps - Week 1, 5

Campers will use handbuilding methods - coil, pinch and slab to create a variety of projects. Possible projects include : working clocks, tea lanterns, vases, animals, bird houses, masks, wind chimes, boxes....



## All Things Sharpie Camp, Week 2

Have fun making beautiful designs and pictures using Sharpies and rubbing alcohol on fabric, glass, ceramics and foil.



## Polymer Clay Camp, Week 2

Make pendants for necklaces out of polymer clay. They can make as many as they would like with a time frame.



## Printmaking and Collage Camp, Week

2 - Learn various printmaking techniques using Gelli prints, collographs and monoprints. Students will use their prints as well as a variety of printed papers and mixed media to make collages.



## Wire Sculpture Camp, Week 2

Wire is a fun and easy way to create almost any image sculpturally. All you need are wire cutters, pliers and wire. Students will learn how to manipulate, connect and build with wire. The subject matter is the choice of the students. Suggestions include animals, figures, vehicles.... Because the class is small, students will get the attention they need to build their individual project.





### Paper Mache Camp, Week 3

Students will build animals and/ or small objects with paper mache. After building small armatures of animals and small objects, students will use paper mache to cover them. On the last day they will be painted. Campers should bring a lunch or snack.



### Jewelry Camp, Week 3

Make original jewelry using a variety of jewelry making techniques with polymer clay, paper beads, metal and wire.



## Fiber Crafts Camp, Week 4

Paint sunflowers inspired by  
Van Gogh

Explore a variety of mediums in the Fiber Arts - Needle Felting, Weaving and Stitchery. Campers will work on several projects throughout the week.



## Hawaiian Arts Camp, Weeks 4,5,8,9

"Aloha mai kakou! You'll learn three traditional lei-making techniques and create both fresh and paper or ribbon lei. You'll also learn about traditional Polynesian paper-like fabric called kapa, and create your own stamps and kapa fashions. We will finish off with polymer clay flowers and accessories and maybe learn a hula step or two!"



## Soft Sculpture and Polymer Clay Camp, Week 6, 7

"Make your favorite foods, pets, or plants as sculptures! Learn the basics of sewing by making soft sculpture out of fabric. You will learn to make a pattern, cut and pin fabric, hand sew, and embellish the soft sculpture. You'll also contrast this with polymer clay sculpture. Learn how to manipulate polymer clay with tools to create detailed mini sculptures!"



## Oil Painting for Teens - Week 7

Beginning through advanced. The class will help beginners feel confident to start and complete a painting. More experienced painters will perfect their skills.

Demonstrations will be given throughout the week on techniques pertaining to landscapes, still lifes, portraits and figures. Students can work from still life set ups or from photographs. A Materials fee of \$15 will be paid to the instructor for brushes. Paints will be included.
